### About the program

Portland State University is committed to serving the needs of the metropolitan area by providing a scholarship program for selected high school juniors and seniors to attend the University for part-time advanced study in a particular academic discipline. LINK is an academic-year program; it does not run during the summer. Typically, students are accepted into the LINK program in the fall quarter for sequential courses in mathematics, foreign languages, and the sciences. Continued participation in the program is contingent upon satisfactory completion of the first quarter. Students are limited to one course per quarter, for which Portland State University credit is granted.

### Who qualifies

To qualify for the program, you must have:

- A 3.00 cumulative grade point average
- Exhausted all available course offerings in a particular subject area
- Outstanding academic performance in the subject area
- Demonstrated maturity and self sufficiency
- Successfully completed the application process

First opportunity goes to high school seniors and to students with documented financial need.

## Scholarship contribution

As a LINK student, you will receive \$150 toward your tuition each quarter of the academic year (fall, winter, and spring). You will be billed for the reduced amount. For current tuition costs, please see [www.pdx.edu/registration/tuition.html](http://www.pdx.edu/registration/tuition.html). You are responsible for the purchase of books and materials, as well as for arranging transportation to and from the University.

## How do I apply?

The LINK program has a limited number of spaces; we encourage you to complete your application as early as possible. Annual application deadline for following fall quarter is always May 31.

The application package is available from our Web site (see below) and includes a signed application and a recommendation (forms provided) from your school counselor and from a teacher in the subject area of interest. These recommendations should be forwarded from your counselor and teacher directly to the LINK office. An application will not be evaluated until all pertinent information is on file. You will be notified by mail of the status of your application. All LINK students are invited to an orientation prior to the start of fall semester.
